


Mammy stops, looks, listens and thinks before she crosses the road to get Simon's burst football.

Simon's Surprise - Extension Activities Enjoy this book with your child. Books are a good way to prompt other

Enjoy this book with your child. Books are a good way to prompt other activities and learning experiences. You can talk about the story, pictures and characters. Encourage your child to ask questions.

Can your child help you to retell the story?

You can also use this story to talk about road safety points such as

- Why do we need to hold hands?
- Where must we hold hands?
- What can we do if it is not possible to hold hands?
- Whose hand is it safe to hold when crossing the road?
- Where are the safe places to cross roads?

Additional ideas

Choose a quiet time and sit comfortably with your child and look at the book together. The focus of this book is about being safe when crossing the road and the importance of holding hands.

- Read the story to your child.
- Encourage your child to ask questions about each character.
- Look at the book again together but this time ask your child to find the pictures that show Simon holding mammy's hand.
- Ask your child to help you to retell the story.
- Can they find the picture of the burst ball?
- Can they tell you what happened?

- Can they remember what mammy said?
- Talk with your child about crossing the road safely together.

Ask your child to think about the different times you go out and when you need to cross the road. Where are you going? How do you cross safely?

Remind your child about the importance of holding hands.

Other activities to do with your child

Role Play

Use toys or family members/friends to recreate different ways to cross the road.

Games

Play games that encourage holding hands such as Ring a Ring of Roses.





