Important notes



A. Tachograph Cards - am I eligible?

To be eligible to apply for a Tachograph in Ireland, you must:

- Have a valid Irish or EU/EEA driving licence with higher categories or
- Have a valid Irish or EU/EEA driving licence with lower categories <u>and</u> you are required to have a tachograph driver card for the lower category vehicle you are driving e.g. electric van weighing up to 4.25 tonnes.
- Be a resident of Ireland with a PPS number.

B. Tachograph Card Fees and where to send your application

You can apply and pay for your Tachograph Card online at www.rsa.ie. <u>It's quicker and you can save €15</u>.

- Online applications cost €45
- Paper applications cost €60 and can only be paid via Payzone. Find your nearest Payzone agent at www.payzone.ie or by phoning 01 207 6000.

Payzone is the only accepted method of payment. Cash, postal orders, cheques and bank drafts are <u>not</u> accepted.

C. Card Information

Renewing your card

- Make sure you apply to renew your card 3 to 4 weeks before the expiry of your current card. Your new card will not be issued until 28 days prior to your card expiry date.
- Once the card expires it cannot record data, it can only be used to display, print or download the data held on it.
- Expired cards do not need to be returned and should be kept for 28 days after expiry. Data must be downloaded from expired cards before they are disposed of.
- You as the driver are responsible for making sure your digital tachograph driver card is renewed before its expiry.

Replacing your card

Replacement applications are monitored closely. Any person who obtains or attempts to obtain a Driver Card by means of a fraudulent or deceptive statement or by producing a forged document commits an offence and is liable to be prosecuted.

- Lost or Stolen Cards: If your tachograph card is lost or stolen, you should apply to have it replaced within 7 calendar days. Any loss of the driver card shall be reported in a formal declaration to the competent authorities of the issuing Member State and to the competent authorities of the Member State of the driver's normal residence if this is different.
- When the replacement is applied for, the driver may continue to drive without a driver card for a maximum period of 15 calendar days or for a longer period if this is necessary for the vehicle to return to the premises where it is based, provided that the driver can prove the impossibility of producing or using the card during that period.
- If driving without a card, you must keep a record of your work and driving hours and can do this by taking a printout from your Vehicle Unit before and after your working day.
 These printouts must be signed on the back by you and include your driver number.
- Malfunctioning or damaged cards: If your tachograph card is damaged or malfunctioning, it must be returned to the Road Safety Authority with your application for a replacement.
- Before you make your application for a replacement mal functioning card, please wipe the chip of the card with a damp cloth using surgical spirits and insert into unit afterwards to see if it works. Make sure you try the card in another vehicle Unit (VU) to make sure it is the card, not the VU, that is faulty. Check the VU manual to make sure it is a card error.
- Replacement cards will be issued within 8 working days of receiving a valid replacement application.
- You need to pay for a replacement if the card is lost, stolen or has been damaged.

Exchanging your card

- Tachograph cards issued in other EU/EEA member states are still valid in Ireland, but you may replace yours with an Irish tachograph card if desired.
- Only valid driver cards issued by other EU/EEA member states can be exchanged.
- If you are the holder of a non-Irish EU/EEA driving licence, you must be a resident of Ireland with a PPS number and you must submit proof of residence.

Change of name, address or driving licence details

- Changes to Irish Driving licences will automatically be updated to the Tachograph Card record.
- If you are an EU/EEA Driving licence holder and your licence number has changed since your last Driver card, then you should email digitaltacho@rsa.ie with the new driving licence number.

D. Proof of Residence

EU/EEA driving licence holders are required to provide proof of residence which must be one of the following:

- A PPSN letter issued to you at your current address by the Department of Social Protection and dated within three months of your application; or
- A utility bill (e.g. electricity, gas or phone) or a bank statement issued to you at your current address and dated within three months of your application.

E. Supplying a photograph

If you are applying for your first Tachograph Driver Card or you have not submitted a photograph with your last renewal, you must provide one passport-size photograph signed and witnessed by a Garda. The Garda must also witness your signature (Section 3 of this form). The Garda must stamp the form with the station stamp and this must be dated within three months of your application. The photo should have a plain white or grey background.

When you are making a first renewal or replacing an existing Driver Card, you don't have to supply a new photograph, but you can if you want to. The photo must be witnessed and signed by a Garda (Section 3 of this form). The new photograph you provide will replace the one held on your file.

F. Processing your application

You will not be issued with a receipt for this application. You should receive your tachograph driver card within two weeks of receipt of this application. If your application is incomplete or invalid, it will be returned to you immediately. Your tachograph driver card will be sent to your home address.

G. Data Protection

Your information is processed in accordance with the law on drivers' hours and tachographs. The RSA may disclose personal data to its agents, contractors and service providers for the purposes of processing your application for a tachograph card. We may also disclose personal data to An Garda Siochana, other road transport authorities and transport enforcement agencies in other EU member states or AETR states, where permitted or required by law.
